



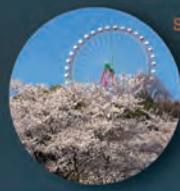
**Obara Inn** was an officially appointed lodging for the feudal lord. He would stay there on his procession between Edo (modern day Tokyo) and surrounding territories during the Edo period. Of the 26 official lodgings that once existed in Kanagawa, this is the last remaining, making it an extremely precious historical resource.



**Kenkyouji Temple** is a Buddhist temple located on the hiking course up Mt Sekirou. In past times, water located by the main outer gate was thought to be helpful for colds and eye ailments. Enshrined within a cave on the temple grounds is a sacred statue.

**Sagamiko Lake Resort Pleasure Forest**

Covering 367 acres this giant leisure facility appeals to those who love the outdoors-combining an amusement park, hot spring, camping and BBQ areas. It's also a popular date spot. In the colder months the mountainside is impressively illuminated in various themes making it the Kanto region's largest illuminated site. The spring time sees the wonderful combination of illumination and 2000 flowering cherry trees.

**EVENTS**



**Lake Sagami Fireworks Festival** historical roots go back to 1948 when it was first held to commemorate those who had died in the building of Sagami Dam and symbolizing a wish for continued future safety. The bigger fireworks climb to heights of 400 meters before lighting up the night skies and sending powerful booms that reverberate around the surrounding mountains.



**Koshu Highway Obara Inn Festival** features the historical reenactment of the Edo period feudal lord's procession along the Koshu Highway. On horseback he is accompanied by a princess and his retinue of officials and domestic servants. Taiko drum performances, traditional tea ceremony and shooting demonstrations using antique rifles are also part of the festival program.

**ACCESS BY TRAIN**

**From Shinjuku Station** catch a JR Chuo Line train. You may need to change trains at Takao Station to continue on to Sagamiko Station. Approx. 60min  
**From Yokohama Station** catch a JR Yokohama Line, Hachioji bound train. Change trains to the JR Chuo Line at Hachioji Station to continue on to Sagamiko Station. Approx. 80 min

**BY CAR**

**From Shinjuku** drive on the Chuo Expressway and exit at the Sagamiko East Exit ramp (approx. 60min). Turn left onto Route 20. A further 5 minute drive will take you to the Sagamiko Station intersection lights with Sagamiko Station to your right and Lake Sagami to your left on Route 412  
**From Yokohama** take the Tomei Expressway Yokohama-Machida IC by way of Ebina JCT exiting at Kenou Expressway Sagamihara IC (approx.30min.), then drive on Route 510/Route 412 (approx.30min.)

 formations as you make your way up  
 to Kenkyouji Temple to the summit of  
 Mt. Sekirou. On clear days Mt Fuji is visible  
 from the summit.

 such as Yose Shrine and Obara Inn.  
 Obara is the patron god of Yose Shrine  
 and is venerated for offering protection to  
 people from plagues ravaging through the  
 area. The patron god was also famous for  
 miraculously helping infants sleep soundly  
 at night.

for beginners, approx. 2 hrs.

Osawa is a clear mountain stream in  
 the area with the legendary Princess Teruta  
 who was washed her hair.

Yose Bridge is a steel suspension bridge  
 built in 1927 with tourists and offering  
 panoramic views over the Katsura River.  
 At the bridge there is a tiny red shrine

The park is set in a prime location to take in the various  
 surrounding lakeside scenery.

On weekends especially, the beautiful views draw crowds of  
 couples, families or drivers wanting to relax before continuing  
 their onward journey.

The lake front shopping promenade located beside the park  
 oozes nostalgia with its retro shooting games and pinball  
 arcade. You can also take a riverboat cruise to fully enjoy Lake  
 Sagami's abundant nature.

Recreational fishing can be enjoyed throughout the year, with  
 Lake Sagami being known for its smelt, black bass and crucian  
 carp.
